

## Microsoft RDS

This connector allows you to set up a connection to a Microsoft Remote Desktop Services (RDS) host to import the applications defined there as ready to use applications within Application Workspace for distribution. For Single Sign On, see first the requirements specified in [SSO for Microsoft RDS](#).

### Prerequisites

- The hostname of the Microsoft RDS Server.
- A username and password to connect to the Microsoft RDS Server.

**TIP:** Alternatively, you can use a credential from the [Credential Store](#) to set up a connection to the Microsoft RDS server.

### Settings screen

**Hostname** – The hostname on which the Microsoft **Remote Desktop Connection Broker** is available. It is recommended to use the fully qualified domain name. In case a connection broker is not available, a session host could be used (limited support).

**Username** – The username used to import the applications; it must have the "domain\username" format.

**Password** – The password used for the identity. **Network credentials** – The network credentials that are set on the RDP connection for the users.

**Install dependency** – Add an install dependency to the managed packages



The account needed for the connection can be set to the Least Privileges. See [Least Privilege – Microsoft RDS Connector](#) for more information.
